2024 Projects

In 2024 the Conservancy significantly increased investment in projects and ongoing maintenance. From preserving historic assets to planting new trees and enhancing gardens, each project reflects our mission to make Lafayette Park a beautiful and welcoming place for all.



Washington Garden Renovation

In 2023 the Conservancy removed overgrown and mismatched shrubs surrounding the 1859 cast of Jean Antoine Houdon's statue of George Washington. We replaced the irrigation system, planted a new boxwood hedge, and hydrangeas to anchor the design. In 2024 we began the renovation of the four circle gardens surrounding the statue, removing overgrown and dying shrubs and decorative trees, and replacing them with new shrubs.



Washington Statue Conservation

Expert conservationists performed maintenance to repair damage to the Washington Statue. The experts used dry-ice to delicately remove the existing coating, treat the damaged area, and apply a new coating.



Tree Pruning, Removals, and Planting

The Conservancy hired private arborists to remove 11 dead trees, and prune another 12. This work was made possible through a cost-sharing grant from the Missouri Department of Conservation. The Conservancy will plant new trees to replace all removals.



Central Lake Fence Repair

Perpetua Iron completed the restorations of two sections of the Central Lake fence. One section had been crushed by a tree limb. The other section had been missing for decades before being discovered in a scrapyard. Conservancy Board Member Ward Buckner negotiated the return of that section, and it was repaired and reinstalled.



Perimeter Fence Repair

In June 2024 Empire Fence restored six sections of the 1869 perimeter fence to the original design. Over the past decade the Conservancy has worked with various engineers and foundries to develop a long-term solution to restore the structural integrity of the fence. This project was a continuation of the initial five test sections completed in 2019. The completion of the additional sections verified the viability of our planned solution for the fence and allowed us to develop a more accurate cost estimate for restoring the remaining 200+ sections (over \$2 million).



Gardening

Volunteer gardeners continue to be the backbone of all gardening and landscaping in Lafayette Park. All gardens in the park are maintained by volunteers who devote thousands of hours to making Lafayette Park beautiful. In 2024 the Conservancy significantly increased investment in new plants and irrigation systems.

2024 Events

Lafayette Park is more than just a beautiful landscape, it's a gathering place that brings neighbors, families, and visitors together. In 2024, the Conservancy built on the success of longstanding traditions while introducing new events that welcomed even more people into the park.

Presidents' Day Ceremony

A standing room only crowd attended the 60th annual Presidents' Day event in Lafayette Park hosted with the Cornelia Greene Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The event featured wreath laying ceremonies at the Washington Statue and Revolutionary War cannon.



Spring Field Day

The first ever Lafayette Park Spring Field Day attracted over a thousand visitors of all ages. The event featured field day races, balloon artists, crafts, tree planting, music classes, a food truck, and cash bar with craft cocktails.



Summer Concert Series

The Lafayette Park Conservancy is a proud sponsor of the Summer Concert Series held by the Arts Council of Lafayette Park. The series of eight concerts attracts thousands of visitors from across the region to Lafayette Park every other Saturday June through September.



Annual Lecture Series

The 2024 series featured three lectures:

- Vandeventer Place, Gilded Age St. Louis
- Mapping St. Louis, A History of the Gateway City in 40 Rare Maps



Soiree for the Park

In October, over 100 supporters gathered for the second annual Soiree for the Park, hosted at one of the most incredible homes in Lafayette Square. The event raised over \$10,000 for the Conservancy, and attracted many first-time donors.



Fall Festival

Following the success of the Spring Field Day, we debuted a fall version to meet the resounding demand for free, all-ages community events in Lafayette Park. The Fall Festival featured the same events as the Spring Field Day, as well as a Pumpkin Patch and Fall Market featuring local vendors.




2024 Revenue and Expenses

In 2024, we continued to strengthen our fundraising efforts, achieving growth across all revenue categories. We also completed our second annual independent financial review and received a clean report, underscoring our commitment to sound financial management. Throughout the year, we maintained sufficient cash reserves to meet all of our financial obligations and ensure the continued stability of our operations. Upcoming Projects

As our work in Lafayette Park continues to evolve, 2025 will bring targeted improvements that address both immediate needs and long-term care. From specialized restoration work to essential maintenance, these projects reflect our ongoing stewardship and careful planning.

Projects

Kern Bathroom Door Replacement

The plain laminated exterior bathroom doors on the Kern Pavilion have deteriorated rapidly over the past year. The Conservancy has engaged St. Louis Sash to build custom solid-mahogany doors that will match the other doors and windows of the Kern Pavilion, reflecting the building's historic character.

Kern Pavilion Acoustic Treatment

The Conservancy has received a grant from the Whitaker Foundation to install acoustic treatment in the Kern Pavilion. Fabric-wrapped panels will be added between the ceiling joists in a way that preserves the historic appearance of the building. This acoustic improvement will create new opportunities for hosting indoor events in Lafayette Park.

Tree Removals, Pruning, Treatments

In 2024, we worked with a Master Arborist to update our tree management plan, identifying 50 trees in need of priority pruning and 25 requiring removal. The total estimated cost for deferred tree maintenance is \$115,000. For 2025, we have prioritized eight removals at a total cost of \$28,750. While a significant backlog remains we are in a far better position than when our tree program began in 2021, and we are optimistic about continued progress.

In 2025, the Conservancy will partner with Arborjet to protect the park's ash trees from the Emerald Ash Borer. Arborjet and SiteOne are providing the materials and equipment, while local arborists are volunteering their time to treat the 19 remaining ash trees in the park. To date, Lafayette Park has lost no ash trees to Emerald Ash Borer, and these 19 trees continue to provide valuable benefits to park visitors. The value of the donated materials, equipment, and labor for the 2025 treatment exceeds \$10,000.

Ongoing Maintenance - Gardening, Irrigation, and More

The Conservancy will continue to provide all gardening and landscaping in the park. Volunteers will devote thousands of hours collectively to tending Lafayette Park's gardens. In 2025, the Conservancy plans to begin hiring paid landscaping support to supplement the efforts of our dedicated volunteers. We have also engaged a private irrigation company to handle the full annual cycle of irrigation maintenance, allowing systems to be brought online earlier each year.

The Conservancy will also continue to address countless small but meaningful maintenance tasks. From replacing missing bench slats and repairing leaking gutters, to painting rusting urns and keeping dog waste dispensers stocked, these ongoing efforts add up to make a significant impact throughout the park.







Volunteers

Volunteers have always been at the heart of Lafayette Park's care and restoration. Their work keeps the park beautiful, functional, and welcoming for all who visit.
